

Outdoor 'Wild Garden' Development (contribution towards the total cost)	The Wild Garden area is currently unusable due to impractical layout and construction, which create hazards for children and staff. Through hands on activities such as planting, growing and consuming fruit and vegetables they will also experience the idea of healthy eating first hand.	£14,365
